### An Afternoon with John Hughes Saturday, November 5, 2:30-3:30pm for adults

John Hughes, former editor and publisher of *The Daily World* in Aberdeen and current chief historian for the Office of the Secretary of State in Olympia, will be joining us for an afternoon discussion of his recent work on *Julia Butler Hansen*, *A Trailblazing Washington Politician and Daniel J. Evans: An Autobiography*. John authored the first major biography of Julia

Butler Hansen, the legendary congresswoman from Cathlamet. He came to know her well when he became a reporter for The *Aberdeen Daily World* in 1966 as Hansen was poised to become the most powerful woman in Congress as the first woman to head a House appropriations subcommittee.



John also recently completed work

as editor of governor Daniel J. Evans' autobiography. In his long-awaited autobiography, Washington's former three-term governor and U.S. senator begins by exploring his family's pioneer roots, which run four generations deep in the Northwest. He continues on to recount his engineering, military, and public service careers that led him to be considered one of the 10 outstand-

for adults



Libby lets you borrow and read ebooks and audiobooks from your Timberland Library for free! All your loans, notes, bookmarks, and reading progress sync across your devices.



#### Kanopy = free films

Stream over 30,000 indie and classic films. Users are allowed eight plays per month. Films come with Public Performance Rights (PPR) and can be streamed in public as long as viewing isn't for commercial profit (i.e. no admission costs or profit made from the streaming).
