An Afternoon with John Hughes

Saturday, November 5, 2:30-3:30pm

for adults

John Hughes, former editor and publisher of *The Daily World* in Aberdeen and current chief historian for the Office of the Secretary of State in Olympia, will be joining us for an afternoon discussion of his recent work on *Julia Butler Hansen, A Trailblazing Washington Politician* and *Daniel J. Evans: An Autobiography*.

John authored the first major biography of Julia Butler Hansen, the legendary congresswoman from Cathlamet. He came to know her well when he became a reporter for *The Aberdeen Daily World* in 1966 as Hansen was poised to become the most powerful woman in Congress as the first woman to head a House appropriations subcommittee.



John also recently completed work



as editor of governor Daniel J. Evans' autobiography. In his long-awaited autobiography, Washington's former three-term governor and U.S. senator begins by exploring his family's pioneer roots, which run four generations deep in the Northwest. He continues on to recount his engineering, military, and public service careers that led him to be considered one of the 10 outstanding

U.S. governors of the 20th century.

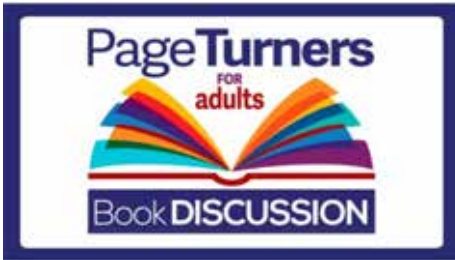
Flowers to Feathers
