She was President of the Puget Sound Mycological Society from 2010-2015, is currently a Board of Trustees Member, the Outreach Chairperson and has served as an identifier, educator and was the annual show scientific display chairperson for over 40 years. She is very passionate about sharing how to hunt mushrooms safely as well as educating people about the role that fungi serve in our ecosystem.

An article in the May 29, 1923 Daily Washingtonian newspaper announced the beginning of Vacation Reading Clubs to encourage children in the fourth through eighth grade to read four fiction and four non-fiction books. After reading four books, students received a button indicating charter membership, and after all eight books a frameable certificate. Hoquiam Librarian, Miss Helen Corbitt, visited Emerson, McKinley and Junior High Schools to promote the program.

Improve computer skills

DigitalLearn.org is a collection of self-directed tutorials to improve digital literacy. Courses cover basic skills, such as using a mouse & computer, navigating a web site, creating an email address and searching. Other courses include specific topics like applying for jobs online, using Microsoft Word, searching for quality health information and staving safe online. Modules are video-based with narration, 6 to 22 minutes long

Order a Library Grab Bag

Tell us what you love to read, listen to, or watch, and our library staff will put together a Library Grab Bag of materials we think you'll love! Library staff will pull 4 or 5 items for you to check out with Library Takeout. It may take 2-4 days before you are notified it is ready for pick up.

Kanopy = free films

Stream over 30,000 indie and classic films. Users are allowed eight plays per month. Films come with Public Performance Rights (PPR) and can be streamed in public as long as viewing isn't for commercial profit (i.e. no admission costs or profit made from the streaming).
