Polson Museum and Hoquiam Library present a series of lectures and programs

When two community entities get together good things can happen.

While the Polson Museum is closed (January 1 - March 31) to update their exhibits, Polson Museum director, John Larson, and Adult Services Librarian, Katie Lutz have put together a lecture series at the Hoquiam Library. The series is co-sponsored by Humanities Washington.

The first program held January 7 featured **Ross Reynolds** speaking on *How Audio Technology Changed the World*.

He explored the impact that audio transmission has had on society and storytelling, beginning with the first century of radio up to the modern age of audiobooks, internet streaming, podcasts, and smart speakers.

The program was well-received by those attending and the series promises to deliver more fascinating presentations. Here are the prgrams that will follow in this series:

Polson Museum Presents: Will the 2020s Roar like the 1920s?

A pandemic, protests, and economic jolts ushered in the so-called "Roaring Twenties." Americans adjusted in ways both innovative and counterproductive. What lessons from the 1920s can we apply to our own looming 20s?

Historian William Woodward charts the eerily familiar developments of a century ago: shattered idealism, social clashes, domestic terrorism, culture wars, disorienting technologies, and fearsome disease. How might stories from a particular moment in the past—one with remarkable parallels to the present—shed light on ways for us to move forward? As the 2020s unfold, what conversations should we have?

William Woodward is an award-winning professor of American and Pacific Northwest history at Seattle Pacific University.

Larson will highlight some his individual favorite images, provide an overview of selected larger collections, teach practical search tips and share insights learned in his 25 years as director of the Polson.


Polson Museum Presents: Local History, Local Resources
